

NOTES to the ACCOUNTS for the YEAR to 30 JUNE 2018

1 ASSETS

FIXED ASSETS

- a. The freehold is situated at 257 Alcester Road South, Kings Heath, Birmingham in the names of, as Trustees, Messrs. Howard Lee, Philip Goodier, Martin Morgan and Andrew Pemberton. The Building has been extended at the rear to provide for additional meeting facilities, and to conform with the requirements of the Disability Discrimination Act. The carrying value of the Property was increased by the cost of the extension and refurbishment. No depreciation has been charged in respect of the freehold property and building; the asset is considered to have a long useful life. The formal valuation as at 30 June 2011 was £330,000.
- b. Office Equipment is depreciated at 33.3% on a reducing balance basis.

c. The principal bankers for the General Fund are Royal Bank of Scotland plc, Holts Branch, Farnborough, Lloyds Bank, Leeds and CAF Bank; a Euro Account is held with AIB, Cork. The MDHQ Petty Cash account is held at Lloyds Bank, Kings Heath, Birmingham.

Related Party - Lions MD105 Lifeskills Ltd

In April 2012 the Council of Governors approved the purchase of the stock, publishing and intellectual property rights of Tacade Ltd following their Administration. The price paid was £15,500 and a non-refundable 'seed grant' of £6,300 (\$10,000) was received from Lions Clubs International Foundation to assist with the purchase. The net price paid was £9,200 and this remains due from Lifeskills Ltd. The Directors of the Company 'Lions MD105 Lifeskills Ltd' are nominated by the Council of Governors, to whom they are responsible.

<u>Post Balance Sheet Event:</u> At their meeting on the 27th July 2018 the Directors voted to repay £3,200 of the outstanding balance, reducing the debt to £6,000.

5 CREDITORS and ACCRUALS

Creditors £ 65,581 includes Tax Liability £4,903, £29,970 held on behalf of LCIF towards future disaster appeals and various

accruals.

6 HEARING and SPEECH

This sum was surplus to the Video production under this name a few years ago. The funds were given for a specific area of service and are currently being used for projects; the balance on the 'I See What Your Saying' badges has been included.

7 PUBLIC RELATIONS RESERVE

This category of expenditure was set by MD Convention Resolution at a minimum of £20,000 per annum. The Reserve outstanding at the end of this year represents: (a) amounts put aside for planned future periodic expenditure, and (b) unspent funds from previous amounts provided.

11 DUES

The Dues collected were £14.25 (£14.25 – 2016/17) per member per half year in accordance with the Constitution based on the Membership numbers recorded at Lions Clubs International Headquarters on 30 June 2017 and 31 December 2017 respectively.

12 INSURANCE PREMIUMS

Insurance premiums are collected in two ways:

Members Liability and Accident cover - via Members' Dues
MD Premises/Contents, Professional Indemnity, etc,
Equipment/Cash on a "All Risks" basis, Legal cover - via charges to Clubs

Insurances relative to The Lion Magazine are paid from within the magazine budget.

Policies were renewed on 1 September.

Polices are placed with reputable insurers. The Council of Governors, having the power to consider a "self insurance" scheme, opted to self-insure Equipment/Cash and Legal Expenses with effect from 1 November 2009. The claim experience in the period to 30 June 2018 was favourable.

Club Insurance Account

The movement in Premiums was not significant. A consequence of the move to Self-Insurance Club Insurance costs made it possible to maintain overall 'Premium' costs per club for 2017/18 at £44.25 (2016/17 - £44.25).

The required cover and premiums are under constant review with a view to securing maximum cover for lesser premium to our Members.

21 FUNDS HELD ON BEHALF OF OTHERS.

In 2013-14 the Multiple District received funding, as an intermediary, from LCIF of £29,970 which is still held at the 2017-2018 year-end. This was received for overseas aid and has been used as a primary source in case of disasters, being replenished from subsequent appeals. The sum of £29,970 is held in the Multiple District's bank accounts at the year end which has also been recognised as Creditors (monies to be distributed in future) so as not to have any effect on the result for the year or closing fund balances.

Review 2017/2018

Overall, the year-end out-turn was in line with expectations and the budget presented to the 2017 MD Convention, a pre-tax deficit of £1,028 being recorded (2016/17 surplus £34,385). 2017/18 was the final year of the Centenary Celebrations and we were honoured to be granted a Royal Reception at Buckingham Palace, hosted by our Patron, HRH Countess of Wessex. The net cost to the Multiple District of this outstanding and historic event was £3,904, within the overall Centennial Committee budget.

The work that began in 2015, in relation to Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) status, has continued. A significant number of Clubs are now registered as CIOs. We have worked through many technical and complex aspects with the Solicitors we engaged and their expert advice has been invaluable.

The decision taken at the 2017 MD Convention, Emergency Resolution 2, to make payment of €25,000 to District 133, Ireland resulted in the creation of a provision of £21,872. This sum was composed of contributions from both the Self-Insurance Reserve and the General Fund. Payment is in three tranches, as follows:

- 1. €9,000 paid 5th July 2017, D133 did not officially exist until 4th July;
- 2. €8,000 paid June 2018;
- 3. €8,000 on or about 30th June 2019.

Council continue to look closely at all areas of expenditure and our Office Manager seeks every opportunity to maximise the income that is generated by our MDHQ building

Net assets amount to £510,812 (£501,324 - 2016/17) of which £394,608 represents Freehold property including Extension and Improvements.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30th JUNE 2018

I report on the accounts of the Multiple District for the year ended 30th June 2018, which are set out on the appended pages.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

As the Multiple District's Members you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts; you consider that an audit is not required under your own rules, nor under any statutory regulations applicable to the Multiple District. TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT for the year ended 30 June 2018

Structure, governance and management

The Trust is an unincorporated trust, constituted under a trust deed dated 1st September 1981 and registered under number 283799.

The Trust was set up with the prime purpose of consolidating donations received from clubs in the Lions Clubs International, Multiple District 105 (covers British Isles and presently divided into 12 districts) to pay over to the nominated beneficiaries as specified by the clubs in response to appeals made by the Multiple District and Lions Clubs International. Over recent times the Charity has been mainly focused on raising/collecting funds for Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). The Trust does not directly fundraise other than from clubs.

The Emergency Fund was set up in 1991 for the relief of suffering resulting from any accident or disaster within the Multiple District or from an accident affecting anyone from the Multiple District.

The power of appointing new trustees is vested in the surviving or continuing trustees for the time being in accordance with the statutory power of appointment of new trustees. The Trust Deed provides for 4 trustees with in addition an Executive Chairman – Chairman for the time being of the Council of Governors of Multiple District 105. When new trustees are appointed appropriate induction and training will be given.

An annual meeting of the trustees is held at the Multiple District Convention or other convenient MD Lions function and there are other interchange communications via telephone/email in connection with approval of accounts and decision making etc. All decisions are made by the trustees.

Approval has been obtained from the Inland Revenue that any donation to Lions Clubs International Foundation by an individual and channelled through this charity can be eligible for Gift Aid.

The trustees are mindful of their responsibilities and receive relevant Charity Commission information.

Governing Document

Originally the accounts had to be subject to an audit by a Chartered Accountant. A resolution was passed by the trustees on 28 July 2017 "The Trustees shall arrange an external scrutiny of the annual accounts which complies with statutory provisions" - effectively this allows an independent

examination. Notified to the Charity Commission and duly noted as an amendment to the governing document.

Risk management

The trustees actively review the major risks that the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at current levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the Charity and confirm that these are kept under constant review.

Objectives and activities

The objective of the Charity is to relieve poverty, distress and sickness and from inception support was given for education purposes and for the supply of safe water in various overseas locations. As reported previously, of late the Charity has been mainly focused on collecting funds for Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) with LCI MD105 Foundation, Reg. No.1164711 now dealing with WaterAid etc.

LCIF has been supported from the early 1980's mainly by collecting and consolidating donations from clubs in response to appeals. LCIF is the grant-making arm of Lions Clubs International with a mission to support the efforts of Lions clubs worldwide in serving communities locally and globally, giving hope and impacting lives through humanitarian service projects and grants. LCIF core objectives: improving local communities, serving youth, providing disaster relief, combating Measles and Rubella and saving sight.

LCIF is a public, non-profit, tax-exempt corporation under the provisions of Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) of 1986, as amended. Incorporated in 1968 in the United States as the charitable arm of Lions Clubs International. In July 2007 it was ranked the No.1 NGO (non-governmental organisation) with which to partner in a study by the Financial Times.

In the fiscal year 2016-2017, Lions clubs, their partners and friends generously donated more than US\$43 million to LCIF and it awarded more than 500 grants totalling in excess of US\$43million. 5,353,081 people helped through US\$17,666,434 in humanitarian grants. US\$+-+12,144,615 in SightFirst grants provided eye care services to an estimated 107,132,689 people and US\$5,436,500 in grants supported the vaccination of millions of children against measles and rubella. 380,000 people helped through US\$5,693,221 in disaster related grants.

LCIF Emergency Grant program provides financial support to Lions and other partners engaged in disaster response and recovery efforts. Major Catastrophe Grants provide significant funds for catastrophes with major international impact.

In 2017 LCIF received its sixth consecutive 4-star rating from Charity Navigator for its effective fiscal management and its commitment to accountability and transparency.

Financial Review, Achievements and performance

The income of the Trust at £233,747.76 (£210,718) is an increase on the previous year.

Charitable expenditure amounted to £234,633.73 (210,707.89) which bar £1,642.63 went to LCIF.

Not all funds donated to LCIF come through this Trust; LCIF recorded an income from MD105 of US\$332,871.91 which at the annual average exchange rate was £246,877.78.

Public Benefit

The main benefits result from disaster relief and humanitarian work of LCIF and as such benefits do relate to our aims and the beneficiaries are members of the public.

Reserves – funds held are restricted.

Future Plans

The trustees plan to continue to operate as outlined above particularly ensuring LCIF is responded to quickly and funds passed to them expeditiously. Also, to identify suitable cases for application of funds from the Emergency Fund.

Trustees' Responsibilities in relation to the financial statements.

Charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity's financial activities during the year and of its financial position at the end of the year. In preparing the statement, the Trustees are required to:

Trustees Report

The Trustees are pleased to present their report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2018.

Constitution and objects

The Lions Clubs International Multiple District 105 Foundation is a registered charity, registered charity number 1164711. The Trust is constituted by a Deed of Trust dated the 4th December 2015. The Foundation is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

The Trustees of Lions Clubs International Multiple District 105 Charity Trust agreed to transfer the assets of the Charity Trust into LCI MD105 Charity Foundation and the Trustees of the Foundation accepted the assets as restricted/and or endowment funds as directed by the donors.

The Charity Commission at the request of the Trustees of both Charities linked the Charities on the 25th May 2016.

The effect of this linking is that:

- the Charities are registered under a single registration number.
- the Trustees are required to prepare a single set of accounts for the reporting Charity and the linked Charity within which the individual funds of the linked Charities are reported as restricted funds and/or endowment as appropriate.
- and that the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice should be used.

The Lions Clubs International District 105 Charity Trust is a registered charity formed on the 14th November 2012, registered charity number 1149750. As a result of the linking above the Registered Charity number has been changed to 1164711-1. Public Benefit:

The Foundation operates the public benefit both in the United Kingdom and Internationally either through direct grants or in partnership with other Charities. The Trustees confirm that they have complied with Section 4 of the Charities Act 2011 in having due regard for the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit.

Grant making policies

Projects and charities supported by the Charity Trust Fund are those supported by the Lions Clubs of Multiple District 105, British Isles and Ireland, some of the projects determined by Lions Clubs International Foundation, constituted in the United States of America. These projects and charities include aid schemes and community support at an international and national level. The scale and level of any donation to the Charity by an individual Lions Club is determined by the members of that Club.

Organisation of the Foundation and Charity

The Trustees who have served during the period are set out in page 1.

The Trustees are appointed by the Multiple District under the terms of the Deed of Trust.

Trustee meetings are held periodically during the period. The Trustees' amount of remuneration or expenses received during the period was £nil (2017: £nil).

The donated income of the Charity during this financial year was £ 238,700 (2017: £299,085). The donations made were £ 265,173 (2017: £209,152). As shown in the statement of financial activities on page 5, the overall deficit for the year amounts to (£ 26,473 (2017: £89,033).

The Foundation continued its partnership with the Loomba Foundation and our International Foundation towards the supply of sewing machines to help establish an income for families in India. A grant of £40,000 has been made towards the second phase of this project.

The Foundation also made a grants to Blind Veterans of £34,176.32 and UNICEF of £14,955.90.

The Trustees ask for a report on the results our donations we have made:



Activity Alliance, formerly the English Federation of Disability Sports, are a national body which has the vision that disabled people are active in sporting and physical activities so they can achieve their full potential.



Lions Clubs enables the charity to hold their Annual National Junior Championship Games in the first weekend in July at Warwick University. Without the funding and physical support of Lions members the games could not go ahead. At this event 206 disabled athletes participate from across the British Isles and Ireland in a variety of track and field sports. A 13 year old disabled cyclist, who participated in the 2017 National Junior Championship Games, said "I see myself as differently able because I do things differently to able bodied people but I am not disabled."



There have been two projects supported through the Lions Centennial year. The major project, being set up by Blind Veterans UK and BLESMA – the Limbless Veterans, to refurbish three disused outbuildings at the Blind Veterans UK Centre in Llandudno. These buildings have been transformed to provide a state-of-the-art complex to re-train current and ex-service personnel whose lives have been shattered whilst on active service. The buildings will be used to provide Life Skills for Independent Living – a tailored programme of counselling and training within the purpose-build accommodation for those younger veterans

who need this vital support.

The secondary project for Blind Veterans UK was supported by the donation of Chester Lions Club Gold Bond places at the 2017 London Marathon. This project supported the Woodland Workshop's operational development with the necessary equipment to be purchased

including specialist hand tools, treadle operated lathe and wood shaving machines, electrical generator, electricity supply to the workshop, open-sided timber building adjacent to the Workshop for use in the Summer months, an access path from the woods

and a 'camp fire' area.

Additionally the funds provided 'smart' IT/Digital equipment for installation in the Independent Living area to demonstrate benefits to blind veterans.

These combined projects will help to provide services to blind veterans to improve quality of life, develop skills, build confidence and encourage users to live more independently.



The Loomba Foundation recognises that generating livelihoods can play a crucial role in ensuring the current and future welfare of widows and their families. It helps widows to take the reins of their lives into their own hands. Through the support of the Lions Clubs International Foundation on the 1-2-4 Sewing Machine Project, Lions Clubs have empowered 1,768 widows in West Bengal and North Eastern States of India, who have received a new Singer foot operated sewing machine.



Each day millions of children in Africa are unable to attend school, often due

to a lack of basic school equipment. Without a good from poverty is impossible and without the resources

education, escape from poverty is impossible and without the resources necessary to learn, an education can be hard to come by. School Aid works to bridge this gap by providing good quality educational materials to meet the diverse needs of young people in disadvantaged communities.

Through the donations made by Lions Clubs, Lions Lifeskills resources have been distributed to Malawi, Tanzania and Lesotho. Over 100,000 children across 136 schools have been reached so far and a further donation of resources has just been sent. School Aid has just received the Queens Award.

Lions Clubs have supported the following projects with UNICEF: the

Children's General Fund, the East Africa Famine Crisis, School in a Box, Street Children, Syria Emergency, Syria Winterisation – Warm Winter Clothing, Winter Blankets and the Yemen Emergency.

Lions Clubs provided 40 'School in a box kits' which is a Unicef resource containing the vital items necessary to run an emergency school/education centre. In a Learning Centre in the Moynerghona refugee Camp,

Bangladesh – the School in a Box helps displaced children to continue with their education.





Lions Clubs have provided winter clothing for 87 Syrian children. This means kitting out vulnerable children with jackets, trousers, fleeces, boots or strong shoes, scarf and a hat, protecting them from the cold.

Tragically, more than 880,000 children are severely malnourished and need immediate life-saving food. The incredible contribution of Lions Club members has meant that UNICEF can continue to be on the ground, providing life-saving services and supplies of clean water, life-saving food and vaccines which are helping to keep children safe from the effects of drought and conflict in South Sudan, Somalia, Ethiopia, Kenya and Uganda. The Lions gift provided

The Lions Clubs donation to the Yemen emergency enabled UNICEF to purchase 20 toilet units which helped to promote dignity, hygiene and crucially, helped the spread of diseases like diarrhoea, dysentery, hepatitis A, and typhoid, as well as cholera





With the Warm Winterisation project, Lions Clubs monies has purchased blankets for 780 babies and children to keep them protected from the harsh winter.

The Lions Clubs donation has enabled 20 full emergency supply kits to help Syrian children. Each one includes: medicines, water safety kits, clothing, and other essential relief items.

The Lions Clubs gift to the Children's General Fund enables Unicef to develop new ways to reach the children most in need. Innovation is vital to improving the state of the world's children. The speed at which global problems, from disease outbreaks, to the global refugee crisis, to millions of out-of-school children, they all disrupt the lives of children around the world and this is growing.

Reserves policy

The reserves of the Charity are held in restricted funds or funds awaiting the Trustees decision for their disposal. The Trustees consider that the trust should build and maintain a level of reserves equivalent to a 75% of the previous 3 years expenditure

Risk management

The Trustees have examined the major strategic and operational risks which the trust faces and confirm that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to minimise these risks. As part of this process, the District has appointed officers to ensure the District's compliance with legislation concerning the protection of vulnerable persons, and maintain a preview of its insurance policies.

1. Accounting Policies

a) Basis of Accounting

Lions Club International MD 105 Foundation is an incorporated charitable organisation registered in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements. The nature of the charity's operations and principal activities is the distribution of donations made to the Fund by member Lions Clubs of District 105.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 (as updated through Update Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

The charity has applied Update Bulletin 1 as published on 2 February 2016 and does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.

The financial statements are prepared on an on going concern basis under the historic cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are presented in sterling and rounded to the nearest £

The significant accounting policies are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied yo all the years presented unless otherwise stated

b) Income recognition

Investment income is recorded when receivable

Donations from Member Lions Clubs of Clubs International are recorded as received from the source donors on a cash basis. Donations paid out are recorded on the basis of the irrevocable commitment of the requirement of the Trustees to make the payment. The Multiple District 105 does not have contractually binding agreements for the level of donations that it makes.

c) Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the Charity in the delivery of its activities. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them. Governance costs include all costs involving the public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice.

A liability will be recognised when the charity has a legal or constructive obligation. A constructive obligation arises where the charity has indicated to a third party that it will undertake certain responsibilities and as a result of these, the charity has created a valid expectation to these third parties that it will discharge these responsibilities.

d) Unrestricted Funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes

e) Restricted Funds

Restricted funds include income received where the donor has specified a particular purpose and a separate fund has therefore been created.

Activities and Achievement review

There is an on-going project to provide two beds for the Gynaecology department of a hospital in Sarajevo. The appeal for funds has been refreshed with some success.

The charity has been successful in sourcing a financial sponsor for a dental chair and, equipment will be provided by the charity Dentaid and has a value of circa £3000. Government has promised local dentist practitioner support in the area of responsibility but request another local school for younger children with intellectual disability is also serviced. This will mean 300 children that previously had no dental welfare. We are seeking UK practitioners to volunteer personal time to ensure the programmes success. Transportation will be provided from UK to Sarajevo by the same financial sponsor. The trustees are currently investigating the route into Sarajevo and the British Embassy is attempting to assist.

During the year a further 10 reconditioned laptops were provided for the school for Intellectual Disability in Sarajevo.

Funds were provided to purchase a CNC machine for carpentry and wax melting furnace to allow for the school to continue producing candles and wooden articles to assist some degree of self support for their funding.

The next project will hopefully enable the charities attention to focus on replacing broken equipment in the sewing and weaving area.

Spot cameras which enable remarkable sight examinations are currently in the process of being purchased in the UK by Lions clubs. It is the intention of the trustees to enable all attendees at the school to have an eye examination, the programme to be supported with government approval and attended by a local eye specialist.

There are numerous requests for equipment and support which will be considered subject to funding being sourced.

As ever - my gratitude to the Trustees for their on-going support.

The Trustees remain very much aware of their responsibility to make prudent decisions.

Reserves Policy

Funds held by the Charity are modest and for immediate use.

Trustees' Responsibilities

Under the Charities Act 1993, the Trustees are required to prepare a statement of accounts for each financial year which

gives a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the financial year and of the incoming resources and application of resources in the year. In preparing the statement, the Trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the statement of accounts.
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its operations.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity at that time and to enable the Trustees to ensure that any statement of account prepared by them complies with the regulations under section 42(1) of the Charities Act 1993. The Trustees share their responsibilities with a sub-committee of which all Trustees are members. This sub-committee includes Lions aware of the objectives of the charity as well as personnel from the charities that they support. All decisions are confirmed by a separate meeting of the Trustees either in person or by email.

The charity works closely with another charity named MCAI (previously known as Child Advocacy International.) MCAI are active in the areas that GFL wish to work and provide local services to support the objectives of GFL. MCAI provide budgeted proposals for the work that is required in the territory and GFL approve those parts that are within their scope and finances, provide funding and receive regular reports on the progress of the projects.

The Trustees ensure that all projects are properly funded prior to commitment and make no commitments that cannot be so funded. In this way the Trustees are confident that the risks involved are kept to a minimum.

Funding of Gift for Living is provided by individual Lions Clubs through their own fundraising activities. Grants are also received from Lions Club International Foundation on a project by project basis. Other individual and corporate donations are received from time to time.

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Lions M D 105 Lifeskills Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" of Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Intangible assets

Intangible assets are initially measured at cost. After initial recognition, intangible assets are measured at cost less any accumulated amortisation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Intellectual property rights are being amortised evenly over their estimated useful life of five years.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

Taxation for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Income Statement, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the year end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

The trustees present their report along with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30th June 2018. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 9 and comply with the charities trust deed and applicable law.

Trustees'

The trustees' names on page 3 have served throughout the year, unless otherwise stated. Appointment of trustees is governed by the Trust Deed of the charity. The board of Trustees is authorised to appoint new trustees to fill vacancies arising through resignation or death of an existing trustee.

Investment powers

The Trust Deed authorises the trustees to make and hold investments using the general funds of the charity, but no such funds are presently held.

Constitution, objects and policies

The Charitable Trust is constituted by Trust Deed, and its object is the funding of activities to further the cure and prevention of blindness.

The policy of the Charitable Trust continues to be to seek additional finance and support to further its object.

Development, activities and financial review

The trustees consider that the performance of the charity this year has been satisfactory. Donations received have increased by £51,633 to £86,660. Direct charitable expenditure has increased to £82,300.

The charity continues to receive donations which are designated to support a Million Miracles cataract surgery in Asia and Africa. These designated amounts are paid to Sightsavers at appropriate times, totalling £82,300 in the current year.

Voluntary assistance received

Sightsavers provides all administration for the charity free of charge.

TRUSTEES REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2018

The Trustees are pleased to present their report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2018.

Constitution and objects

The Lions Clubs International District 105 Youth Activities Trust is a registered charity, registered charity number 287292.

The objects of the Trust Fund are to distribute donations made by the members of Lions Clubs of Multiple District 105 British Isles and Ireland, Lions Clubs International, Lions Clubs International Foundation, Lions Clubs from other districts and other organisations. The collection and distribution of donations is monitored by the Trustees and Multiple District Officers.

Multiple District Officers are appointed annually by the Council of Governors of Lions Clubs International MD105 British Isles and Ireland.

Public Benefit

The Trust continues to operate to the public benefit both in the United Kingdom and Internationally either through direct grants or in partnership with other Charities. The Trustees confirm that they have complied with Section 4 of the Charities Act 2011 in having due regard for the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit.

Grant making policies

The charity supports projects and charities which fall within its charitable objects. It has a particular focus on helping youth providing facilities in the interests of physical and social welfare to benefit young people at a local, national and international level. The trustees have discretion as to who benefits from the charity's support and review their grant-making policies and appeals every year. Some grants are committed for a number of years in advance (funds permitting). The scale and level of any donation to the Charity by an individual Lions Club is determined by the members of that Club.

Organisation of the charity

The Trustees who have served during the year are set out on page 1. The Trustees are appointed by the Multiple District under the terms of the Deed of Trust. Trustee meetings are held periodically during the year. The Trustees amount of remuneration or expenses received during the year was £Nil (2017 - £Nil).

Achievements and performance

The Lions of the United Kingdom make a donation of £4.00 a member to the Lions Youth Trust and as can be seen from these accounts these regular annual donations are rebuilding the Trust, although with increasing costs, it will necessary to consider an increase in this sum within the near future.

The Trust has also financed and promoted a Young Ambassadors programme with entrants from the United Kingdom together with supporting a Young Leaders in Service Programme and supporting our LEO's activities. The Trust supported and organised a successful Youth exchange program for over 40 young people from across the world. We are planning a similar programme of activities for the coming year.

Financial review

During the year ended 30 June 2018, gross income received aggregated £38,014 (2017 - £41,115); Gross expenditure aggregated £40,103 (2017 - £33,562). As shown in the statement of financial activities on page 5, the overall deficit for the year amounts to £2,089 (2017: surplus of £7,553).

TRUSTEES REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2018

Reserves policy

The reserves of the Charity are held in restricted funds or funds awaiting the Trustees decision for their disposal. The Trustees consider that the trust should build and maintain a level of reserves equivalent to 75% of the previous 3 years expenditure allowing for the Trust to commit to the financing of three years Youth Camps.

Risk management

The Trustees have examined the major strategic and operational risks which the trust faces and confirm that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to minimise these risks. As part of this process, the District has appointed officers to ensure the District's compliance with legislation concerning the protection of vulnerable persons, and maintain a preview of its insurance policies.

Trustee's responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

The Trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP 2015 (FRS102);
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008, and the provisions of the Deed of Trust. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2018

1 Accounting policies

a) General information and basis of preparation

Lions Club International is an unincorporated charity in England. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements. The nature of the charity's operations and principal activies is the distribution of donations made to the Fund by member Lions Clubs of District 105.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 (as updated through Update Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

The charity has applied Update Bulletin 1 as published on 2 February 2016 and does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historic cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are presented in sterling and rounded to the nearest \mathfrak{L} .

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

b) Income recognition

Investment income is recorded when receivable.

Donations from Member Lions Clubs of Clubs International are recorded as received from the source donors on a cash basis. Donations paid out are recorded on the basis of the irrevocable commitment of the requirement of the Trustees to make the payment. The Multiple District 105 does not have contractually binding agreements for the level of donations that it makes.

c) Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the Charity in the delivery of its activities. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them. Governance costs include all costs involving the public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice.

A liability will be recognised when the charity has a legal or constructive obligation. A constructive obligation arises where the charity has indicated to a third party that it will undertake certain responsibilities and as a result of these, the charity has created a valid expectation to these third parties that it will discharge these responsibilities.

d) Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

e) Restricted funds

Restricted funds include income received where the donor has specified a particular purpose and a separate fund has therefore been created.

1 Accounting policies

f) Designated funds

Designated funds have been set up by the Trustees for the benefit of the causes supported by the charity.

g) Endowment fund

A restricted endowment fund was set up in appreciation of Burt Mason, an International President of Lions Clubs International. Both the endowment and the interest may be used if felt justified by the Trustees.

h) Cash at bank

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

i) Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

j) Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The charity made no key judgements or estimates during the process of preparing the financial statements.

Youth Trust Programmes

- a) Youth and General Donations to the Youth Trust are received into the Youth Fund and are designated by the Trustees to fund the various programmes of the Trust. The General fund covers some of the costs of the Young Leaders in service programmes, and may provide leaflets and other materials to be used by the Trust in support of its objectives. The Trustees made the decision to close the designated fund and transfer the balance to the general fund.
- b) Young Ambassadors The aim of this programme which operates throughout Europe, is to recognise, encourage and support young people who are actively involved in the welfare of the community. In previous years, candidates have been involved in helping the young and older people, able, disabled and disadvantaged. Candidates have also organised projects in conservation, crime prevention, hospital radio and promoting healthier lifestyles.
- c) Youth Camps & Youth Exchange is a programme committed to broading the international awareness amoung young people worldwide. The programme emphasis the value of community life and sharing in a different country giving young people through learning and experience an enhanced international understanding and awareness.
- d) Young Transport is a programme that provides funds for the travel of attendees at the Youth camp and between their hosts within the United Kingdom and Ireland. Transfers from this fund to the Youth Camp & Youth Exchange funds are in respect of the transportation of young people on the youth exchange programme
- e) Youth Fund Reserve following closure of the Youth and general designated fund, all income received for youth projects in general are now recognised as general fund income. The Youth Fund Reserve has been created to ringfence a surplus in reserves that is available to fund shortfalls on future Youth projects.
- f) **John Hunt Memorial Fund** is an unrestricted fund set up in appreciation of a donation received in memory of John Hunt, a past district governor of Lions Clubs International. The Trustees have chosen to ringfence the donation to fund the support and development of young people.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2018

10 Funds (continued)

Transfers were made from the Youth Fund to the Young Ambassadors and Youth Camp Funds amounting to £5,987 and £5,685 respectively, to allocate funding for specific youth projects as agreed by the Trustees.

A transfer was made from the General Fund to the Young Ambassadors fund amounting to £5,822 to fund an excess of expenditure over income on this project.

A transfer was made from the general fund to the Youth Fund Reserve amounting to £24,476 to put aside excess reserves available to allocate towards future youth projects.

11 Endowment fund

The Burt Mason Bursary - is a restricted endowment fund set up in appreciation of Burt Mason, an International President of Lions Clubs International. The fund provides for the attendance of members of our Youth organisation to attend an International Youth Camp. Both the endowment and the interest may be used if felt justified by the trustees.
