It's also an opportunity to experience the great hospitality that the South West can offer and to meet up with friends old and new.



"TEAM" defines her leadership and passion for service, "Together we must Empower, Assist and Mentor one another."



The Grand Pier




it's one of the best things to



do in Weston-Super-Mare whilst you stroll the shore.








Weston-Super-Mare Beach is a firm favourite on a sunny day! With a huge area of sandy goodness, it's perfect for traditional seaside chillout right on the shoreline. Plus, the water is quite calm for a little dip, too. Though always remember that the tidal range in Weston-Super-Mare is extreme, this means the water can go out quite significantly, exposing boggy areas of the shore.

These can be dangerous as you can get stuck. Always explore with caution and remember the tide comes in very fast. Afterwards, take a walk down the pier and try your luck on the penny drops, slot machines and soft toy grabbers. Also, if you're wanting to avoid the

crowds around the Grand Pier, take a stroll or drive over to Brean Beach, It's huge and just as stunning.

Mendip Hills




