

LIONS ROAR 2024 – Onboarding, Admin, Enrolment and helping schools through to success

Marketing and Introduction

1. Mid-February. Agree for your Club to run ROAR and help school children to dream & think big!!

- 2. Mid-March. Review the Programme details, contact Primary Schools and get their interest
- 3. April / May. Explain ROAR to schools, and gain their agreement to run the Programme
- 4. May / June. Ensure that School/s agree to run & fully resource the Programme

Admin & Enrolment

5. By End-June. Collect registration information for each school on form provided for your use

- 6. By End-June. Forward £170 per school to your District Treasurer and Register on ROAR System (Typeform)
- 7. 8bi check Registration System, invoice Districts for registered schools. DTs pay 8bi invoice & in September pay MD Charities Treasurer for Programme Admin.
- 8. 8bi enrol 'paid for' schools on to the LIONS ROAR
 System, send the Teacher
 Pack and provide system
 access to schools

Introduction, Teacher Pack & Programme Execution

- 9. Sept / Oct / Nov Schools & optionally Lions run ROAR Kick-Off, note, 8bi have 4 'check-ins' with schools during ROAR
- 10. Mid-November schools run programme, select winners, award certificates & **produce video** of the winning entry for District Finals
- 11. By 22nd November,
 District Finals completed,
 District Winners selected for
 the National Awards Day and
 details sent to 8bi
- 12. On 4th December 2024 LIONS ROAR National Zoom Awards Day – hosted by 8bi & Lions. District Winners recognised & rewarded.

LIONS ROAR 2024 – 8billionideas and Lions Programme Follow - Up

Once the Programme is up and running from September, 8billionideas (8bi) and Lions ROAR Teams will track how things are going, 8bi have agreed to call schools as part of this process, see below the planned tracking for this year's programme.

- 2nd September 8bi contact schools to see if launch is planned, does the school understand what needs to be done, are there any questions about the program
- 16th September 8bi contact schools to see that the launch has taken place
- 29th September 8bi contact schools to ensure general timeliness of the progress to date. At this point 8bi will remind schools to plan to complete school finals by the recommended 15th November, and that the Video Submission Closing date is 24th November
- 1st October 8bi provides MD ROAR Team with a report identifying schools where further action may be needed
- 14th October 8bi check that school have planned the school final, and remind them that they can work with their local Lions Club for their finals, and remind them of the best way to shoot the video
- 20th October District ROAR Team check with Clubs to ensure school finals are planned or to prompt them to do so
- 12th November- District ROAR Team check with Clubs to confirm their Finals have occurred, or are imminent, remind them that the Video Submission date closes on 24th November
- 18th November 8bi send MD ROAR Team report of videos submitted / not submitted
- 19th November District ROAR Teams check with Clubs school winner's videos have been sent or will be imminently

LIONS ROAR 2024 – Onboarding, Admin, Enrolment and Payments and follow up

- 1. February 7th The Marketing Team will run ROAR Information Evenings on Zoom for DGs, MD Officers and the ROAR Team. The sessions will start at 7-30pm and last an hour Zoom details later in this presentation.
- 2. February 12, 13, 20, and 21st and April 4 & 10th (Updates) The Marketing Team will run ROAR Information Evenings on Zoom for interested Lions. The sessions will start at 7-30pm and last an hour Zoom details later in this presentation.
- 3. Between February & June Clubs decide if they wish to sponsor schools at £170 each.
- 4. Between March & July Clubs get schools interested and committed to the programme.
- 5. Between March & end July (early September in exceptional cases) For each school that has agreed to run the programme Clubs send £170 to District Treasurer (DT), identifying the school / club's name etc.
- 6. Between March & September For each 'paid for' school, clubs load information onto Registration System confirming schools have agreed to run the programme and have been paid for.
- 7. Between March & September On last Friday of the month 8bi invoices Districts for schools registered that month. DTs send £150 / school to 8bi, identifying schools / sponsoring club. September DTs send all £20 / school to MD Charities Treasurer.
- 8. Between May & September 8bi cross check the Registration System and where money is paid to 8bi, they send Teacher Packs to schools and Lions Clubs. For 'paid for' schools 8bi enrol schools onto the ROAR System and provide access, passwords etc. in preparation for in-school Programme Launch.
- 9. Between Mid-August & Mid-September For any anomalies, 8bi and Lions Admin team follow up with Clubs and resolve.

Admin & Finance Note to Club Treasurers

Dear Club Treasurer,

LIONS ROAR 2024 Programme by Lions Clubs International and 8BillionIdeas

We hope this email finds you well, a quick heads up on the ROAR2024 Programme that is being rolled out in your District.

The ROAR2024 Programme is aimed at serving primary school children, encouraging them to think big, create world changing ideas and then present those ideas to their schools and to their Lions Districts. There will be a National Awards Presentation that will recognise all the District Finalists. The Programme has been running in 105SE and 105CE for over 6 years and now as an MD Youth Programme we have engaged 134 in 2023, and we expect it to grow the numbers this year.

ROAR is run in conjunction with our partners, 8billionideas, and they provide the digital infrastructure and IP on which the programme is based.

When registering a school into the ROAR programme a Club will need to pay £170 per school to their District Treasurer. The cost from 8BillionIdeas is £150 per school, the difference will be kept in a designated MD account and used to provide marketing materials, prizes and other programme related items.

The MD process is that when registering a school, the sponsoring Club is required to confirm that they have put in place their own Club payment process to pay the District Treasurer £170 per school. On the last Friday of each month from May to September 8billionideas will invoice District Treasurers £150 per registered school, the Teacher Packs (programme introduction for schools) will be sent to the schools the following week. District Treasures will pay £150 to 8billionideas per school and a £20 Administration Fee per school will be sent to MD to fund the programme.

Once 8BillionIdeas have received payment from District Treasurers, the school will be formally enrolled on the ROAR2024 Programme and will then have access to the IP and materials for the ROAR Programme and can kick off the in-school programme as soon as they wish. The Teacher Packs will be sent more immediately to schools and Lions Clubs to enable a fast start.

So, our ask of you is that you prepare to work with your Club on the ROAR2024 programme and when asked to do so, submit those payments to your District Treasurer, identifying the schools for which the payments are made by separate email.

Admin & Finance Note to District Treasurers

Dear District Treasurer,

LIONS ROAR 2024 Programme by Lions Clubs International and 8BillionIdeas

We hope this email finds you well, a quick heads up on the ROAR2024 Programme that is being rolled out in your District.

The **ROAR2024 Programme** follows the very successful ROAR2023, it is aimed at primary school children, encouraging them to think big, create world changing ideas and then present those ideas to their schools and to their Lions Districts. ROAR is run in conjunction with 8billionideas who provide the digital infrastructure and IP for the programme. The ROAR Programme has been running in 105SE and 105CE for over 6 years and has engaged over **100,000 children since launch!!**

Before Clubs register schools on the programme, they will pay £170 per school to you. The charge to Lions by 8billion ideas is £150 per school and the remaining £20 will be used to provide marketing materials and other programme related items from a designated MD ROAR account.

The process is that when registering schools, sponsoring Clubs are required to confirm they have in place their own Club payment process to pay you £170 per school. On the last Friday of the month from May to September 8billion ideas will send you an invoice asking for payment of £150 for each school registered by Clubs in the District during the previous month. You are asked to pay this promptly noting that the sponsoring Club will now be referenced to each school listed on the invoice.

Please retain the balance of £20 administration fee for each school. In September when the final number of schools registered in each District will be known, you will receive a request from the ROAR Team to pay the £20 administration fees for all registered schools to the MD Charities Treasurer.

Once 8BillionIdeas have received payment from District Treasurers, the schools will be enrolled on the Programme and be given access to the IP and materials to kick off the in-school programme. In the meantime, Teacher Packs will be sent to schools and Lions Clubs to enable a fast start.

So, our ask of you is that you prepare to receive payment from Clubs for the ROAR programme and when asked to do so, submit those payments to 8BillionIdeas and the Multiple District Charities Treasurer, Paula Mellows, identifying the schools for which the payments are made.
