Remember it is your members Convention so if you have any ideas for Convention please let me know.

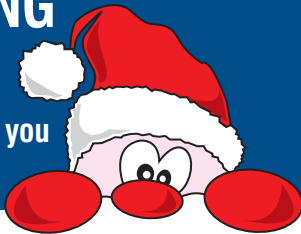
No promises. I would love to know your thoughts on what Convention should look like.

SANTA IS COMING

Important notice for Clubs who organise their Santa sleigh events. Please ensure you take out cover for this event.



The Lions main insurance cover excludes any activity which is related to vehicles. This would mean any incident when out collecting with the Sleigh or the towing vehicle would have to be covered by the vehicles insurance. This would include Santa riding in the sleigh and collectors walking alongside the sleigh.

Lions Clubs offer a motor policy which can be purchased by clubs to cover the towing vehicle and sleigh. If a club decides to take motor cover elsewhere they need to obtain in writing from the insurer that they will cover any passenger liability for Santa and any injury for people walking alongside the vehicle if hit by the vehicle or sleigh and that they understand what the vehicle is going to be used for.
