



KING'S HAEMATOLOGY PATIENT RECEIVES THE ALL CLEAR AFTER STEM CELL TRANSPLANT

Earlier in 2023, Tony and Rosemary Carter's son was admitted to Davidson ward at King's College Hospital to have treatment for Lymphoma on his brain with B cells. Having previously been a very healthy 46 year old husband and father, the diagnosis came as great shock to him and his family, with symptoms that appeared out of the blue.

He received wonderful care in Davidson and LIBRA wards, having chemotherapy over four months and a stem cell transplant, which were both very successful. He is now home with his wife and eight year old daughter, ready to live his life to the full.

Tony said "We are truly grateful for all the wonderful care and attention our son received at King's College.

As we are members of our local Lions club COGS, we were aware of the contribution that the Lions make to LIBRA to enable the hospital to update wards and continue research into blood cancers and disorders. It is good to know that such amazing care exists and that the doctors, nurses and all other staff give exceptional care to all the patients in these wards."

Tony and Rosemary were also able to deliver a cheque to to an afternoon presentation for Lions clubs locally at the hospital, meet the staff who cared for their son and see the refurbishment of the Derek Mitchell Ward and new day room. The contribution that Tony and Rosemary have donated to LIBRA can now be put towards other lifesaving treatments, so more families can receive care like Tony and Rosemary's son.

"I was diagnosed with APML last July and was transferred to King's for immediate treatment. I spent time on Elf and Libra ward, as well as a longer stint on Davidson. I finished treatment and achieved remission earlier this year and my husband and I wanted to give back to the hospital somehow. We read about LIBRA which has connections to both King's and obviously, haematology. We wanted to raise money for LIBRA to either aid with research, or possibly enable the hospital to purchase equipment.

We held a quiz night at The Westow (who kindly waived the room hire fee for the event) in Crystal Palace. We had roughly 80 people attend which made 15 quiz teams! We also ran a chocolate tombola and raffle - all the raffle prizes were generously donated by our family, friends and local businesses.

We hope to host at least one fundraising event every year for incredible blood cancer charities."

All of us at LIBRA are incredibly appreciative of the hard work Sarah and Tom put into organising their quiz night and we are sure the feeling is the same for Anthony Nolan and Billie's Fund.
